The Care Quality Commission published a report on Harmoni

The Care Quality Commission has today published a report on Harmoni - North Central London, run by Harmoni HS Ltd. The report highlights good practice in a number of areas, including, robust systems in place to ensure that important information is distributed, read and understood by relevant staff, and action plans implemented and reviewed in a timely way, with a continuous audit.

Camden Public Health has commissioned Solutions 4 Health to provide free and local NHS Health services for everyone in the Camden area. The NHS Health Check is a free 20 minute assessment available for Camden residents age 40-74 years (or 30+ if South

Asian), who have not had a NHS Health Check in the last five years and are not currently diagnosed with, or taking medication for any cardiovascular condition.

The NHS Health Check is designed to identify early symptoms and reduce the risk of stroke, diabetes, heart disease and kidney disease before conditions have a chance to develop.
